<b>Music</b> To increase the wake and shake style activities provided in school. <b>Sponsored Run</b> To encourage running within the school community.	A whole school sponsored run was organised on Stovell Playing Field. Parents came to watch and had the opportunity to run.	£25	All children ran with KS1 and Reception running one lap of Stovell Playing Field and KS2 running two laps. Parents were able to run one lap and a large number chose to run. There was an enthusiastic response to the sponsored run. Some parents may take up park run as a direct result.	This was a successful event which was organised with the help of the TSSSA and WSSP. It could be an annual event.
<b>Street Tag</b> To encourage fitness outside school.	A competition between schools involving collecting virtual tags by either walking, running or cycling around Windsor.	No Cost Won £100	The competition runs for roughly 12 weeks. Parents need to download the app and then the scores are recorded on a leader board.	Street tag was suggested by WSSP and had good reviews from schools who had taken part previously. This was a popular activity amongst parents and children. Next year TSS need to register and get parents onboard right at the start. We came to the competition a few weeks late.
<b>PE from WSSP</b> The children benefit from three terms of WSSP coaching throughout the school year. This session is in addition to their regular PE lesson.	PE Lead considers the range of coaching options available to ensure that the PE Curriculum is covered. Some of the activities involve specialism such as dance coaching which the children may not otherwise receive. All children have a term of dance with a dance teacher from a local dance school. In addition to this there are opportunities for sporting competitions.	£6,750	The WSSP dance lessons are enjoyed by the children across all year groups Year 1 to Year 4. Many of the children have taken advantage of the dance opportunities made available especially free workshops during lockdown. As a direct result of the school lessons, some children attend the local dance school in Windsor '4Motion'.	Dance will remain on the WSSP timetable for 2022/2023. During the coming year the PE Lead will ensure that links between the local dance school and Trinity St Stephen remain and are strengthened. Year 2 and Year 4 children will also compete in the WSSP Dance Festival.
<b>PE from Premier Sports</b> Provide the children with a weekly PE lesson taught by a sports specialist.	All children from Year 1 to Year 4 receive a weekly lesson with a specialist PE teacher from Premier Sports. These lessons fit the curriculum. All children take part in gymnastics and athletics along with a mixture of multi-skills lessons, net and ball skills. The WSSP lessons are planned after	£6,295	Children have a positive relationship with the Premier Sports Coach. Being able to cover gymnastics with a specialist teacher means that the children develop the skills at the appropriate level.	During the coming year Premier Sports will be given time to share individual pupil assessment with teaching staff. <b>Craze of the Week</b> Make breaktimes and lunchtimes more active.	Children in KS1 and KS2 have a set of equipment allocated to them at playtimes for one week. This could be Hoola Hoops, Scoops etc. The children have the equipment for one week before the equipment is changed. This keeps the activities new and exciting and encourages children to play and be active. This is run by the sports leaders.	£1,162	The children have enjoyed the new equipment and the range of activities. With different activities in KS1 and KS2 we were able to keep our bubbles separate and not share equipment. Playtimes are incredibly active and busy and the feedback, from the children, has been very positive.	The sports leaders should continue to run this during the morning playtime.
